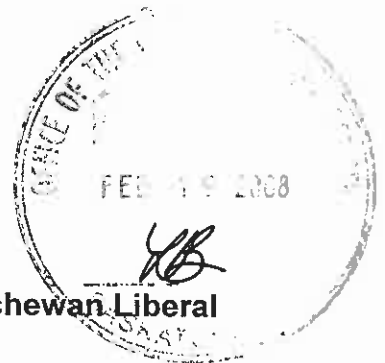

## AUDITOR'S REPORT

To: **Margaret Pulfer, Business Manager of Jim Pulfer, Saskatchewan Liberal Candidate, Saskatoon Fairview.**




I have audited the return of election expenses of Jim Pulfer for the campaign period from October 10, 2007 to November 7, 2007. This return is the responsibility of the business manager. My responsibility is to express an opinion on the return based on my audit.

Except as explained in the following paragraph, I conducted my audit in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards. Those standards require that I plan and perform an audit to obtain reasonable assurance whether the return is free of material misstatement. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in return. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by the business manager as well as evaluating the overall return presentation.

Due to the nature of the types of transactions inherent in any election campaign, it is impracticable through auditing procedures to determine that the accounting records include all transactions for the campaign period. Accordingly, my verification of these transactions was limited to the amounts recorded in the accounting records of the business manager and candidate and I was not able to determine whether any adjustments might be necessary to those expenses.

In my opinion, except for the effect of adjustments, if any, which I might have determined to be necessary had I been able to satisfy myself as to the completeness of the records as described in the preceding paragraph, the return presents fairly, in all material respects, the financial transactions of the candidate's campaign required by section 261 of *The Election Act*, 1996 to be detailed in the return of election expenses for the campaign period from October 10, 2007 to November 7, 2007.

A "**Schedule of Adjustments**" is attached which lists changes I determined to be necessary, clarification of certain items and comments on certain items.

**Jim Pulfer: Schedule of Adjustments November 7, 2007 Election  
(Saskatchewan Liberal Candidate - Saskatoon Fairview)**

1. The Saskatoon Fairview Liberal Campaign received loan advances in the amount of \$500.00 from Jim Pulfer that was shown as contributions. The full amount of \$500.00 has been repaid.
2. The Saskatoon Fairview Liberal Campaign earned \$0.79 of interest from FirstSask Credit Union, this is an immaterial amount.
3. There was no invoice or supporting documentation detailing the \$5,000.00 advertising expense paid to CTV Television other than proof of payment (i.e. cancelled cheque and CTV Statement of Account). It would appear this was a joint agreement arrangement with several Saskatchewan Liberal campaigns.
4. There was no allocation, if applicable, made of whether some goods supplied (i.e. door knockers) were consumed in the pre-writ period. The invoices from Staples were dated prior to October 10, 2007.
5. The Credit Union services charges were not included in the Election Expense Return.

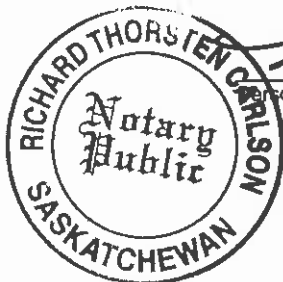

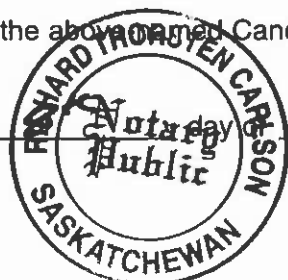
