AUDITORS' REPORT

To: Robert Stadnichuk, Business Manager of Gord Bedient, Candidate in the Election in the constituency of Saskatoon Silversprings.

We have audited the return of election expenses of Gord Bedient, Candidate in the election in the constituency of Saskatoon Silversprings, for the campaign period from October 10, 2007 to November 7, 2007. This return is the responsibility of the business manager. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on the return based on our audit.

Except as explained in the following paragraph, we conducted our audit in accordance with Canadian generally accepted auditing standards. Those standards require that we plan and perform an audit to obtain reasonable assurance whether the return is free of material misstatement. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the return. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by the business manager, as well as evaluating the overall return presentation.

Due to the nature of the types of transactions inherent in any election campaign, it is impracticable through auditing procedures to determine that the accounting records include all transactions for the campaign period. Accordingly, our verification of these transactions was limited to the amounts recorded in the accounting records of the business manager and candidate and we were not able to determine whether any adjustments might be necessary to those expenses.

In our opinion, except for the effect of adjustments, if any, which we might have determined to be necessary had we been able to satisfy ourselves as to the completeness of the records as described in the preceding paragraph, the return presents fairly, in all material respects, the financial transactions of the candidate's campaign required by section 261 of *The Election Act, 1996* to be detailed in the return of election expenses for the campaign period from October 10, 2007 to November 7, 2007.

We further report that contributions received by the campaign total \$46,000.91 and expenses total \$41,951.80 and Candidate expenses paid the campaign total \$447.64 (included in expenses total). Candidate expenses paid by the candidate total \$41.22.

Good Morning Gord,

We are summarizing our understanding of the terms of our prospective engagement as auditors to report to your business manager under the Elections Act on the Candidate's Return of Election Expenses relating to your candidacy in the Constituency of Saskatoon Silversprings at the Election to be held on the 7th day of November 2007.

As required by the act, our report will be addressed to your business manager, *Robert Stadnichuk*, and will state whether, in our opinion, the Candidate's Return of Election Expenses presents fairly the financial transactions contained in the books and records of the candidate or will contain an assertion that an opinion cannot be expressed. As required by the act, in our report we shall make such other statements as we consider necessary if, in our opinion:

- a) We become aware that the return to which the report relates does not present fairly the financial transactions required by Section 261 to be detailed in the candidate's return,
- b) We have not received from you or your business manager all the information and explanation that we have required, or
- c) Proper accounting records have not been kept by your business manager so far as appears from our examination.

It should be noted that the act does not require us to report that all financial transactions pertaining to the candidacy have been included in the accounting records, and in our report we shall state this fact. Of course, were it to appear from our examination that there have been a significant omission from the accounting records, it would be necessary for us to make a statement in our report.

You have indicated that you understand that our examination will be such as to enable us to report as required under the act. The timely preparation and completeness of the accounting records and the return, which is to be prepared in accordance with the accounting provisions of the act, are the responsibility of your business manager. Our responsibility as auditors does not extend beyond the reporting function outlined above and, accordingly, does not include ensuring that you and your business manager comply with all the requirements of the act.

In the absence of circumstances that would prevent us from expressing an opinion without additional statement or reservation, our report will be similar to the enclosed sample auditors' report.

You have agreed to provide appropriate vouchers for personal expenses to support the amounts recorded in the Statement of Candidate's Personal Expenses.

You have also agreed that you or your business manager will ensure that invoices for goods and services will state the current market price when this price is more than the price charged to the business manager.

Because our examination will be planned and conducted to enable us to express a professional opinion on the Candidate's Return of Election Expenses, it will not be designed, and cannot necessarily be expected, to identify defalcations and other irregularities. Of course, the discovery of irregularities may still result from our examination and, if so, they will be reported to you.

It may be necessary to perform certain auditing procedures at any time before or after the election date. We understand that we will have access at all reasonable times to all records, documents, books, accounts, and vouchers held by you and your business manager pertaining to the election, and may require from both of you such information and explanations as are necessary to complete our examination and report. Concurrent with the issuance of our report, we shall require that certain assurances that we consider of significance when forming our opinion be provided to us in writing by you and your official agent in a manner similar to the enclosed sample representation letter.







2. This Return must be accompanied by the auditor's report to the business manager of the candidate on the information given in this Return.

3. The commercial value of goods and services donated (other than volunteer labour or goods valued at \$200.00 or less), and the difference between the amount paid and the commercial value of goods and services provided, are considered to be election expenses. If the total of "commercial value" is greater than the total of "amount paid" it is the larger of the two figures that is used in the calculation of election expenses incurred by the candidate. 4. A statement, signed and receipted, by the donor and by the business manager, supported by a verification from an independent commercial source of the amount expensed must be submitted when making claim of commercial value as an election expense.

A true and correct copy, certified by the business manager, for each such statement of contribution received pursuant to subsections 240(6) and (7), must be affixed to this Return (ss. 261(3)).

Revenue received by a candidate from fund-raising activities, meetings and sales of material of a promotional nature are deemed contributions. The total net proceeds from each source indicated must be recorded and, in the aggregate, reported in this Return.

The value of donations in kind must be recorded and included as a contribution received by the business manager where claimed as an election expense. Accordingly, commercial value is an election expense and a contribution concurrently.
