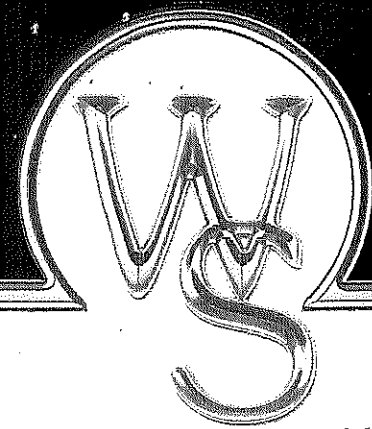

To the Business Manager for Fred Ozirney Saskatchewan Party Candidate Saskatoon Riverside Candidate:

I have audited the return of election expenses of the Committee to Elect Fred Ozirney for the campaign period from October 10 to November 7, 2011. This return is the responsibility of the business manager. My responsibility is to express an opinion on the return based on my audit.

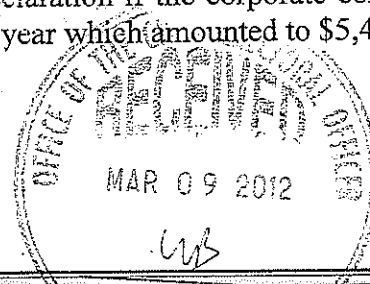
Except as explained in the following paragraphs, I conducted my audit in accordance with Canadian generally accepted auditing standards. Those standards require that I plan and perform an audit to obtain reasonable assurance whether the return is free of material misstatement. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the return. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by business manager, as well as evaluating the overall return presentation.

Due to the nature of the types of transactions inherent in any election campaign, it is impractical through auditing procedures to determine that the accounting records include all transactions for the campaign period. Accordingly, my verification of these transactions was limited to the amounts recorded in the accounting records of the business manager and candidate and I was not able to determine whether any adjustments might be necessary to those expenses.

Section 240(6) of The Election Act 1996 requires contributions from a corporation, trust fund or constituency association to be accompanied by a statement which sets out the name of and the amount contributed by, each person who contributed in excess of \$ 250 in a year and whose contribution was used to make up the contribution from the corporation, constituency association or trust fund. The statement must identify the person authorized to make the contribution and must be certified by the business manager, that the information on the statement was true and correct.

The return includes four contributions from the constituency associations. There was only one signed statement included in the candidate's records which confirmed a cash contribution of \$ 17,000. There were no statements for the additional cash contribution of \$ 2,000.

The return includes corporate contributions of \$ 6,130. There were no statements signed by the person authorized to make the corporate contribution or declaration if the corporate contribution included any individual contributions in excess of \$ 250 per year which amounted to \$5,400.



The corporate contributions, in excess of \$ 250 includes a contribution-in-kind for \$ 400 and an expense for goods, item number 26 under the goods supplied category includes an expenditure for \$ 400. The donation statement was not signed by the donor nor was there supporting information for the commercial value of the donation.

The return included personal contributions of \$ 6,210 which were segregated into contributions over \$ 250 and contributions less than \$ 250. The individual contributions, greater than \$ 250, includes one contribution for \$ 300. This contribution was made to the Saskatchewan Party candidate who was originally going to run in the Riversdale constituency who resigned and was replaced by Fred Ozirney. The amount was agreed to a copy of the contributor's cheque and the donation had been transferred to the Saskatchewan Party as a donation for the Fred Ozirney campaign.

There was donation-in-kind for computer equipment and accessories which was not recorded as a contribution by an individual the category of which could not be determined since there was no supporting information as to the commercial value during the writ period. The original purchase of the equipment was made March 1, 2011 by the original candidate for the Saskatchewan Party for the Riversdale constituency. The Fred Ozirney election committee did not pay for the equipment but there is a campaign photo that does indicate that there is a laptop that was used in the campaign. The business manager did indicate that the laptop used in the campaign was the same one purchased by the original Saskatchewan Party candidate for the Riversdale constituency. The March 1, 2011 cost of the equipment was \$ 778.64 and this amount was not included as a donation-in-kind. The commercial value of the equipment purchased March 1, 2011 would not likely be the same as the original purchase price since it would be considered used equipment. The market value of computers and related accessories does depreciate quickly therefore the March 1, 2011 value may not be a reasonable estimate of the commercial value for the writ period. The commercial value of the computer should have been recorded as a contribution based on the commercial value of the equipment during the writ period. There was no supporting information as to the commercial value of the equipment during the writ period.

The premises rent paid for the writ period does seem high for the area that was leased for that period.

Item 4 under service expenses, relates to insurance for a 3 month period starting September 1, 2011. The premium that is outside of the writ period is \$ 311.54. According to the insurance company the \$ 450.00 is the minimum premium retained by the insurance company.


Item 12 under service expenses, relates to billboard rental that was billed to the original Saskatchewan Party candidate but was paid by the Fred Ozirney campaign. The campaign did use the billboard service during the writ period but the invoice was made

Item 21 under goods supplied, includes some expenditures that were incurred before the writ period. These expenses amounted to \$1,185.90 which was represented as expenditures for expenses to be used during the writ period. I was not able to determine if the expenditures qualified as eligible expenses.

Item 25 under goods supplied, which is 20% of the original invoice amount for a computer, scanner and computer bag. The original purchase of the equipment was made March 1, 2011 by the original candidate for the Saskatchewan Party for the Riversdale constituency. The Fred Ozirney election committee did not pay for the equipment but there is a campaign photo that does indicate that there is a laptop that was used in the campaign. The business manager did indicate that the laptop used in the campaign was the same one purchased by the original Saskatchewan Party candidate for the Riversdale constituency. The March 1, 2011 cost of the equipment was \$ 778.64 and this amount was not included as a donation-in-kind. The commercial value of the equipment purchased March 1, 2011 would not likely be the same as the original purchase price since it would be considered used equipment. The market value of computers and related accessories does depreciate quickly therefore the March 1, 2011 value may not be a reasonable estimate of the commercial value for the writ period.

Item 28 under goods supplied, which is use of a van for advertising. The donation statement of the donor was not signed nor was there any supporting information as to the commercial value of the use of the van.

In my opinion, except for the effect of adjustments, if any, which I have determined to be necessary, had I been able to satisfy myself as to the completeness of the records as described in the preceding paragraphs, the return presents fairly, in all material respects, the financial transactions of the candidate's campaign required by Section 261 of The Election Act, 1996 to be detailed in the return of election expenses for the campaign period October 10 to November 7, 2011.

2. This Return must be accompanied by the auditor's report to the business manager of the candidate on the information given in this Return.

3. The commercial value of goods and services donated (other than volunteer labour or goods valued at \$200.00 or less), and the difference between the amount paid and the commercial value of goods and services provided, are considered to be election expenses. If the total of "commercial value" is greater than the total of "amount paid" it is the larger of the two figures that is used in the calculation of election expenses incurred by the candidate. 4. A statement, signed and receipted, by the donor and by the business manager, supported by a verification from an independent commercial source of the amount expended must be submitted when making claim of commercial value as an election expense.

Revenue received by a candidate from fund-raising activities, meetings and sales of material of a promotional nature are deemed contributions. The total net proceeds from each source indicated must be recorded and, in the aggregate, reported in this Return.

The value of donations in kind must be recorded and included as a contribution received by the business manager where claimed as an election expense. Accordingly, commercial value is an election expense and a contribution concurrently.


