

SASKATCHEWAN VOTER RIGHTS

TO BE ELIGIBLE TO VOTE IN A SASKATCHEWAN GENERAL ELECTION OR BY-ELECTION, YOU MUST:

- Be a Canadian citizen;
- Be at least 18 years old;
- Have lived in Saskatchewan for at least the six months before the day the election is called, and
- Be ordinarily a resident in the constituency on the day the election is called.

ALL ELIGIBLE VOTERS HAVE THE RIGHT TO:

- Ask for assistance marking your ballot if you are unable to do so;
- Ask your employer for three consecutive hours off work to vote if your work schedule does not provide for three consecutive hours while the polls are open;
- Be registered on the voters list as a voter;
- Decline your ballot and have it recorded as such;
- Have an interpreter assist you;
- Keep your vote secret;
- Request a new ballot paper if you accidentally damage or destroy the one you have been given;
- Request instruction on how to mark and fold the ballot;
- Request to vote immediately outside the polling place if you are physically unable to enter the polling place;
- Review the voters list and apply for revisions;
- Vote if you are waiting in line when the polling place closes, and
- Vote privately and free of interference.
