THE CANS & CANNOTS FOR CANDIDATES

Below are highlights only. Candidates and their representatives should refer to *The Election Act*, 1996 and the E-418 Guidelines for Candidates' Representatives for more details.



Candidates must appoint their representatives using an Appointment of Candidate's Representative Form (E-417). This form must be completed, dated and signed by the candidate for each of their representatives before they go to the polls.



A candidate **CAN** act as his or her own representative. In such instances, an E-417 form does **NOT** need to be completed.



Candidates acting as their own representatives should identify themselves as such to the DRO and **provide ID** immediately upon arriving at the polling place.



4 Candidate representatives **must wear a name badge** at all times while at the poll. The name badge should display the candidate representative's name and the name of the party endorsing the candidate.



5 While at polls, candidate representatives cannot wear anything featuring their party name or logo. This includes shirts, jackets, hats, pins, etc. In addition, any clothing featuring colours of any registered political party must not be worn at the polling place (including green, blue, orange and red).



Candidate representatives must **NOT** engage with voters in **ANY** way while in the polling place. This includes greeting voters waiting in line to vote, as well as speaking to voters who have already voted but not yet left the polling place.



Candidate representatives cannot use communication devices or take any photographs within the polling place. This includes smart phones, tablets, laptops, and smart watches.



Candidate signage must **NOT** be placed within 50 feet of a polling place on voting day. This includes advance voting locations during advance voting.
