Get Ready to Vote

in the Swift Current 2018 Provincial By-Election

1 Get registered.

To vote in the by-election, you have to be registered. It's how Elections Saskatchewan makes sure you're allowed to vote. They want to know that you

- ✓ are a Canadian Citizen
- ✓ are at least 18 years old
- ✓ have lived in Saskatchewan for at least 6 months, or usually live in Saskatchewan



You can register on by-election day when you go to vote, or you can register early to save time. (Registering on election day usually means waiting in line for a while!)

Register early.



By phone. Call **1-877-958-8683** to speak to an Elections Saskatchewan staff.



Online. Go to elections.sk.ca and click where it says "Register to vote or update your information".

Register on by-election day.



In person. You can fill out a registration form when you go to vote.

2 Decide how you want to vote.

There's more than one way to vote! You can vote



In person, on election day.

Most people vote this way.



In person, before election day.

Already know who you want to vote for? You can vote early at an advance poll.



By mail.

Going to be out of town during the by-election? Then you're an absentee voter, and you can still vote! There's a ballot kit you can download and complete by mail ahead of time.



At home.

If you're homebound because of a disability, or are caring for someone who's homebound, you might be able to vote at home. Elections Saskatchewan can tell you if you're eligible, and how to apply.

3 Find out where you'll vote.



If you're voting in person, you need to know where to go! You vote in a different place depending on your neighbourhood, so no one needs to travel too far to vote.



If you registered early, you might have received a Voter Information Card (VIC) in the mail. It tells you where and when to vote.



If you didn't get a Voter Information Card (VIC) in the mail, don't worry! Elections Saskatchewan can tell you where you're supposed to go to vote.
