You can vote if you are:

1 A Canadian citizen.



2 At least 18 years old on October 26, 2020.

3 A Saskatchewan resident for at least the six months before the date the election is called.



We strongly recommend all voters wear a mask to the polls.



Why vote?

Voting is a way to participate in a democracy. As an eligible voter, you have the right to vote in a provincial election. The province looks after everyday things like driver's licences, education, health care, transportation and highways.

Your vote counts! Voting allows you to voice your opinion on who you want to represent you. All votes are equal and confidential. No one will know who you voted for.

Voting is easy. At the polling location you will be handed a ballot. Mark an X beside one candidate's name. Drop it in the ballot box. That's it!



Register to vote

Your first step is to register to vote, which you can do now. Registering to vote puts you on the voters list. If you've registered before but have moved recently or changed your name, you can update your voter information.



You can register or update your information either online at www.elections.sk.ca/register, or call us at 1-877-958-8683.

Watch for your voter information card



You will receive a voter information card in the mail closer to election day. We mail a card to all registered voters. This card is important.

It tells you when and where you can vote. We plan to offer a polling location on all First Nations land.



You can choose to get your card by text or email instead of in the mail. You can change how you want your card delivered at the same time you register or update your information at www.elections.sk.ca/register.



More information about voting will come out closer to election day.
