Friday the seventh day of November, 2014, from three o'clock to ten o'clock;

Saturday the eighth day of November, 2014, from twelve o'clock to seven o'clock;

Sunday the ninth day of November, 2014, from twelve o'clock to seven o'clock;

Monday the tenth day of November, 2014, from three o'clock to ten o'clock;

- e) the number of votes cast for the several candidates to be added up on Tuesday the twenty-fifth day of November;
- f) a return to the writ to be made on Saturday the sixth day of December.
